A grower, teacher, and student of permaculture, Klaus Harvey has facilitated designing and planting of orchards and native hedgerows. As a member of Transition Town Kinsale since 2006 he has managed many projects including a Community Supported Agriculture scheme to grow oats locally – the first CSA to grow edible oats locally in Ireland.



### ECO-ANXIETY

Gary Tyrell & The Climate Ambassadors

The more we realise what is happening to our planet, often the more eco-anxiety can be tied into that awareness. There are ways to help, in the words of Professor Sarah Jaquette Ray: “preserve yourself for a lifetime of thriving in a climate-changed world”. 

